fencing/escrime (with épées), climbing wall, French cars, Durkins, camel and pony rides, kite flying, face painting, the Raffle draw at 6pm and a very special surprise Finale starting at 7pm.

This year's Fête celebrates bilingualism and international cooperation, featuring fine foods from all over the world and cultural displays. We have a good number of embassies involved (7), and the layout will be similar to last year's, with a central stage.
